## MISSION

The Leominster Public Library is a service organization which provides information in various formats free to the residents of Leominster and the surrounding communities. The purpose of the public library is (1) to provide information, materials, programs, technology, systems, facilities, and services which are most wanted by the residents of our service area; (2) to provide safe, easy, and convenient access to these services and (3) to actively work to raise awareness and promote our services to the community and organizations within our service area.

## SERVICE HIGHLIGHTS

To the Honorable Mayor and Members of the City Council:

I herewith submit the Annual Report of the Leominster Public Library for the fiscal year July 1, 2009 to June 30, 2010:

- Offered 3,290 hours of service
- Loaned 373,195 books, audio-books, DVDS , video cassettes, compact discs, museum passes, and discovery kits
- Answered 43,370 information/reference questions in-person, by telephone and via the Internet
- Presented 384 programs attended by 15,112 patrons of all ages
- Processed 34,763 network transfers & interlibrary loans for Leominster Library patrons
- Provided 44,980 sessions of public computer use
- Provided full library service to 24,523 registered Leominster residents
- Utilized 3,165 hours of volunteer assistance
- Added 9,527 new items to the library's collection
- Provided library meeting and group study room space 3,165 times for community groups, non-profit organizations, and individuals
- Registered 781 Friends of the Leominster Library members

However, the best feature is the staff. They are always courteous, efficient and pleasant. I really cannot compliment them enough. . . .

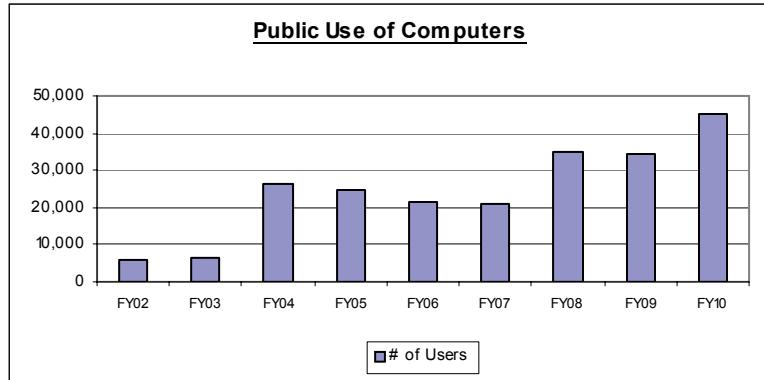
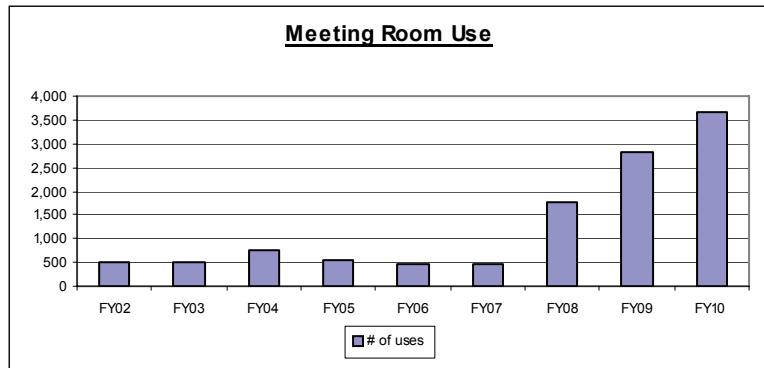
Congratulations on having "The Best Librarians in the World." I am fortunate to be a patron.

## NOTEWORTHY

- Launched the Grant Resource Center- Leominster to support fundraising efforts of area non-profits.
- Finalized remediation required for library's walkways and ramps, and obtained permanent occupancy permit.
- Accepted as a Foundation Center Cooperating Collection by the Foundation Center of New York to provide additional resources to area non-profits in the Library's Grant Resource Center.
- Deployed seven (7) new public access computers through Year 1 of the Gates Foundation Grant.
- Installed "People Counters" at both the Pearl Street and West Street entrances.
- Finalized computer VLAN project, and moved all public computers to new FIOS connection to better control costs.
- Planned and executed 3rd annual celebration of the Dr. Martin T. Feldman Children's Room, and the 2nd and 3rd annual Clara Lane Memorial Concerts funded through private donations.
- Planned programs to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the 1910 library building with a portion of these programs presented in the 2nd half of FY10.
- Developed and Trustees' approved new Library Programming Policy to address the many issues that have arisen since the new library opened in June 2007.
- Developed library Facebook page to promote teen programs and services.
- Received a mini-grant from the Central MA Library System for \$1,000 to create a research-based/validated Mental Health Collection.
